President's Message

The High Holidays' is fast approaching. The Jewish New Year provides each of us the opportunity to reflect on our relationships with others and to make amends. It is the time to begin the year among those for whom we care, coming together with family and close friends to greet one another or to share a visit or meal with each other.

Rosh Hashanah, the New Year festival and Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, which follows ten days later, comprises what we call the High Holy Days. Many of us think of them as two separate holidays but Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur form the beginning and end of the ten day period of penitence. The beginning is a subdued Day of Remembrance where we look back at the past year as well as forward to the New Year and the end is a day of penitence and complete fasting. This is a time of introspection and self appraisal, designed to lead to positive change. The holiday is designated as one of repentance for wrongs committed against family, friends and neighbors, either knowingly or unknowingly and restitution is to be made.

We hope to greet each of you at temple for our beautiful, meaningful services on the High Holy Days and to remind you of our first day luncheon at TooJays and our second day luncheon at Temple. In addition, we hope you will join us for our annual breakfast to be held at Colony Cottage.

September brings us Labor Day, which is celebrated by Temple Shalom with a wonderful outing. The day was first observed on Sept. 5, 1882, by the Central Labor Union of NY. Labor Day became a Federal holiday in 1894 (mainly for political reasons), and was designated

a festival for workers and their families. The holiday accentuates some essential Jewish values – such as honoring the dignity of work and the humanity of each citizen, regardless of religion, status, or wealth. A few famous Jewish American labor leaders include David Dubinsky, president of the ILGWU. He was also instrumental in the creation of the CIO and was a founder of the American Labor Party. Another very famous Jewish laborite is Samuel Gompers, who was the founder and leader of the AFL. His humble beginnings were as a cigar maker. Sidney Hillman headed the Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union which later merged with the CIO. And then there is Jackie Presser, president of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, who used considerable assistance from his youthful connections to organized crime leaders to legalize and strengthen the Teamsters. And for all of you who still labor, thank you for your contribution to America's productivity!
